Stephanie Dietrich

Professor in diaconal studies, VID Specialized University, Campus Diakonhjemmet Oslo. She holds a PhD within Systematic and Ecumenical Theology from MF Norwegian School of Theology, and has worked as Senior Advisor on Theology at Church of Norway Council on Ecumenical and International Relations. She has many years' experience in ecumenical dialogue, both on a national and international level. Currently, she is a member of the World Council of Churches Commission on Faith and Order, the Lutheran-Orthodox Joint Commission and the European dialogue between the Community of Protestant Churches in Europe and the Pontifical Council for Promoting Christian Unity (Roman-Catholic Church). Her main area of interest and field of publication is ecumenical theology and - cooperation, and diaconal studies.



Abouna Alexi Chehadeh

Abouna Dr. Alexi Chehadeh serves actually as the Director of the Department of International Relations and Development (DERD) of the Greek Orthodox Patriarchate of Antiochia and All the East (GOPA), thus coordinating the development- and relief work of DERD in Syria. Father Alexi is an orthodox priest and holds a PhD from the University of Münster, Germany, on "Islam and Violence: Theological Reasons for the Use of Violence by Islamists". He has a Master of Arts degree in Islamic Studies from University of Hamburg. He has lectured on a variety of topics at the University of Balamand (Lebanon), the Institute of Mission, Ecumenism and Religious Studies and the Asia-Africa Institute, University of Hamburg. In addition, he has participated in many international consultations on peace, the ethics of peace, the war in Syria, and Christian-Islamic conversations. From 1993 to 2013, he served as priest of the Antioch-Orthodox Archdiocese of Europe, between 2000-2007 vicar of the Metropolitan and since 2007 as "Exarchos of Antioch-Orthodox Archdiocese of Germany". End of 2013 His Beatitude Patriarch John X. asked Father Alexi to move to the Middle East to assist Him in the main residency in Syria and Lebanon. He is a member of the Lutheran-Orthodox Joint Commission and Chief Editor of the Patriarchal Magazine "AL-NASHRA".
